OCTOBER PROGRAM – JEFF KELBLE. SHENANDOAH RIVERKEEPER

Jeffrey (Jeff) Kelble was a river guide, primarily for small-mouth bass, on the Shenandoah River for eight years. He was driven out of business by fish kills in 2002, 2004, and 2005. That's when he stepped in to restore the health of the river as Shenandoah Riverkeeper

His methods are to observe the Shenandoah River and its watershed for sources of contamination. The problems he finds include discharges from processing plants, erosion from construction sites, and direct deposit of manure from cattle and poultry.

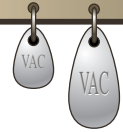
In 2006, Kelble and the Waterkeepers Alliance sued two large corporations for excess discharge of phosphorus and nitrogen into the Shenandoah River and sued a waste water treatment plant. He won both suits. Kelble also won the right to review construction site permit applications before they are approved. These are just a few of the court actions Kelble has taken to protect the river.

If you all have considered fishing the Shenandoah, Jeff will be a great source of river health and likely fishing spot information.

EXCELLENT MENHADEN PROGRAM - SEPTEMBER MEETING

Our guest speaker for the September Membership Meeting was Chris Moore, Science Advocate from the Chesapeake Bay Foundation. Chris gave what might be the most thorough history of the species and an overview of the current regulation status of this important forage fish that the VAC has hosted.

Chris is very active in getting the ASMFC on board with protective actions for menhaden in the waters of the Commonwealth.

FINAL TWO VAC 2012 TOURNAMENTS IN NOVEMBER

The final two tournaments of the Virginia Anglers Club 2012 angling year fall in November. First, there is the Virginia Speckled Trout - Red Drum Tournament on November 3-4. The second and final tournament is the James River (Chippokes Creek) Gar Tournament on November 17-18. Angling Activities Chairman Parks Rountrey provides details the two tournaments and offers some catch advice on page 9 of this Angler.

SPECIAL DISCUSSION AT OCTOBER MEMBERSHIP MEETING

CANCEL THE CV KINNARD ANGLER OF THE MONTH AWARD?

Cancellation of the C.V. Kinnard Angler of the Month Award (effective 12-1-12) was among the four angling rules changes recommended by the Angling Rules Committee (ARC) for adoption by the Board of Directors. The ARC felt that low participation in this award justified cancellation. President Glenn Carter will conduct an open discussion at the October Membership Meeting to be sure (1) why this recommendation was made and (2) to be sure it reflects of feelings of the VAC Membership..

A second recommended change was the addition of the Northern Snakehead in the list of fresh water species that the VAC recognizes for club records and awards. The ARC needs some time to do an assessment of actual Northern Snakehead catches to establish a meaningful set of basic weights. The other recommendations were reducing basic weights for rooster fish and the verification of the current use of date/time of catch to determine winners of fish of identical points or weights in non-tournament submissions. The final set of Angling Rules changes will be announced at the November BOD meeting and publicized in the November Angler.

CATCHY COMMENTS

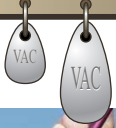
Virginia had another fantastic Marlin season this year with 75 Sails, 110 Blue Marlin, and 826 White Marlin to date. In fact, the Red Drum and Speckled Trout bite is going on right now. Our club managed two saltwater entries for the past newsletter period. Former member, Randy Cullinan of "Predator Fishing Systems", recently said he had heard the VAC was leaning toward being a freshwater fishing club. I can't prove him wrong this month!

Charlie Fasano did manage a Club record, a saltwater entry with a 13 pound, 2 ounce, Blueline Tilefish on 50 braid fishing near the Norfolk Canyon. This 164 point catch will replace Mickey Kodroff's 11 pound record and takes the lead on both the "species" and "heaviest" categories.

Several weeks ago, Randy Cullinan, Billy Dale, and I fished off Hatteras and landed three Wahoo. We missed numerous others and lost our share of tackle with cut-offs above our wire leaders. The fish weighed 38, 33, and 28 pounds. All in sight of Dean's Wreck in 40 fathoms!

Recently, Ricky Dale took his friend Jeff Doughty, and Jeff's wife, Angie, to the CBBT on his 29' Regulator. With thoughts of filling the freezer with a limit of large Flounder, the crew did manage to land a variety of species including Bluefish, Black Sea Bass, and Spot. Angie said the fishing was really great, but didn't understand why the fish were *so small*. Capt. Ricky Dale said that he is "breaking the boat in slow and will be gradually building up to "keeper fish"! Love this editorial privilege.





While speckled Trout fishing with Stuart Lee, Bobby Broughton caught a nice 3 pound, 1 ounce, fish off Oregon Inlet with a grub for bait. The trout is worth 122 points on 6# spin. Stuart keeps great records of every fishing trip and when he put his trout rod away last weekend, he had landed 1,296 trout this season in North Carolina! Quite a bit better catch than the 300 plus season of last year.

Sal Peluso sent in four 50 point entries of Flounder, Bluefish, Common Pompano, and Red Drum from the surf at Buxton, NC. He wants to earn his "Anglers Rating" before the old salt, John Wetlaufer, attains his rating. John has been working on his rating for over 30 plus years!

Lee Rothgeb had four freshwater entries this past period including a Smallmouth Bass, a Largemouth Bass, and two 18 pound Flathead Catfish. The highest point Catfish is worth 243 points and was caught on 4# tackle using a live Bluegill for bait from the James River.

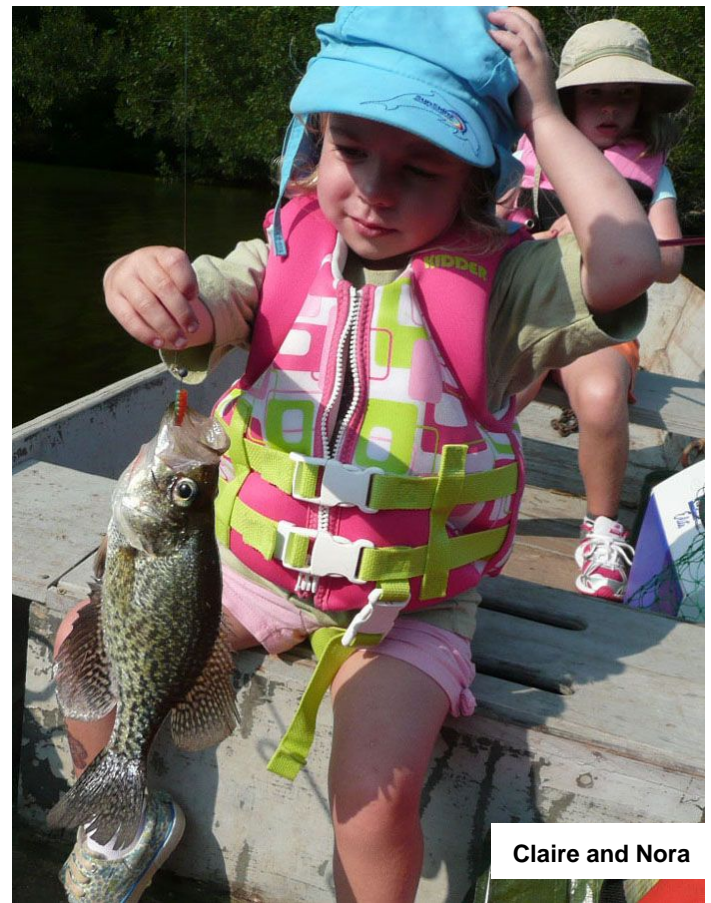
Capt. Art Conway of "Conway's River Rat Guide Service" continues to land a variety of fish from the Chickahominy Lake. Art turned in a Sunfish, a Yellow Perch, and a 11 ounce Black Crappie. The Crappie had the most points with 109.

Fishing the James River in early September, Bob Brown landed two nice Smallmouth Bass. Bob's largest fish weighed 3 pounds, 12 ounces, and was caught on live bait on 6# tackle. The 171 point species takes the "heaviest category" lead. The 3 pound, 8 ounce, Smallmouth was landed on 4# spin using a buzz bait and worth 253 points which was the highest point entry this month!

The waters are cooling down and the fall migration is getting into full swing. Let's go catch some fish!

PROPOSED VIRGINIA ANGLERS CLUB BY-LAW AMENDMENTS

The proposed amendments to the By-laws of the Virginia Anglers Club are published for the second time for the information and understanding of the voting membership of the Club. The amendments will be voted upon by show-of-hands vote at the regular November Membership Meeting, November 27, 2012 which starts at 7:00 PM at the Skilligalee Restaurant.

Color Key: Added text in **BLUE**. Deleted text in ~~BLUE~~ with strike thru.

Commentary on proposed amendment inside brackets in **[RED]**.

Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws of the Virginia Anglers Club

Article I - Organization

Section 1: The officers of this organization shall consist of a president, a first vice president (programs), a second vice president (angling activities), a ~~conservation~~ third vice president (conservation and legislation), a recording secretary, ~~an assistant~~ a newsletter secretary / webmaster and a treasurer (as amended 1/22/94).

[Amends By-laws to reflect present officers and their titles.]

The election of members to the board of directors and the election of officers shall be by ~~the card~~, **electronic** or letter ballot among resident, non-resident and life members, upon which the nominations made by the nominating committee shall appear. Space is to be provided for write-in votes. All ballots received post-marked prior to December 31st shall be counted, and the election of new officers and directors shall be certified by the judges of election, who shall be two (2) in number appointed by the president of the club (as amended 11/27/07).

[Amends By-laws to delete balloting by card and to include electronic balloting for officers.]

Vice president

Section 3: In the absence of the president, the first, **second or third** vice president (in order and if present) shall preside and perform all of the duties of the president. ~~In the absence of the president and first vice president, the second vice president shall preside and perform all the duties of the president. In the absence of the president and first vice president, the second vice president shall preside and perform all the duties of the president.~~ In the absence of the **third** vice president, the board of directors shall appoint a president pro tem.

[Amends By-laws to reflect "pro-tem" duties of the three (3) vice presidents and simplifies verbiage of Section 3.]

Secretaries:

Section 4A: It shall be the duty of the **recording** secretary ~~and assistant~~ to keep a complete record of the proceedings of the organization, ~~the name and address of each member~~, to issue the notices of meetings, to conduct correspondence and to do such other things as they may, from time to time, be requested to do by the president or board of directors.

Section 4B: It shall be the duty of the **newsletter secretary / webmaster** to collect and edit information for the monthly newsletter, *The Angler*, and convey such information to the person(s) producing and distributing *The Angler*. As webmaster, he/she shall be responsible for the functionality and content of the Virginia Anglers Club website, maintain the official roster of Club members thereon and issue any special electronic informational notices as requested.

[Amends By-laws to be consistent with titles and duties of current secretaries.]

PROPOSED VIRGINIA ANGLERS CLUB BY-LAW AMENDMENTS

Article III

Memberships

Section 5: **Any prospective member must attend one regular membership meeting.** Prospective members residing within a twenty- five (25) mile radius of Richmond must attend one ~~regular membership~~ meeting and one orientation meeting prior to **being voted on** for acceptance and Prospective resident members ~~must~~ **should** be accompanied by **their** first sponsor. (as amended 9-28-76).

[Amends By-laws to be consistent with current requirements and practices regarding prospective members.]

Section 6: There shall be a class of membership designated "life members" who would be those persons from the club membership, elected by the board of directors, who by reason of their activities, have made an outstanding contribution to the Virginia Anglers Club, the improvement of sport fishing, and the conservation of natural water resources. **Any member who attains the rating of Master Angler, will automatically become a "life member".** ~~This membership~~ "Life Membership" provides the same rights and privileges as that of an active membership but without assessment of annual dues (as amended 5-14-73).

[Amends By-laws to include attainment of the rating of Master Angler as an automatic qualification to become a "life member"]

Article IV

Dues

[Amends By-laws to delete an optional dues assignment no longer offered.]

Article V

Meetings

Section 3: A quorum shall consist of a minimum of twenty (20) members present at any regular or special meeting (as amended 9-24-68). **A quorum may also consist of a combined return of a minimum of twenty (20) electronic and paper ballots where an issue is presented for a membership vote via the internet with members not having access to the internet receiving paper ballots by mail.**

[Amends By-laws to permit electronic balloting to be used where an issue needing a vote by voting members is not conducted at a regular or special meeting.]

Tournament News

Virginia Speck Trout & Redfish Tournament*: November 3-4 (blow date following weekend)

Note: Fishing area includes all Virginia waters, but no tournament fishing allowed inside private "hot ditch" on the Elizabeth River.

Since our spring Red Drum tournament was blown out, we are adding red drum as a second species for this tournament. Recent speck and red drum fishing has been the best in many years! Our tourney will be at a peak time for actively feeding fall spotted sea trout. This is a two species event including red drum – so it's like two tournaments at the same time. Both these fish can be caught on all the same artificial or live baits. For light tackle points - various soft plastic baits and mirro-lures are effective on light spinning and plug gear. Fish are available in skinny water and very easy to get to so any trailerable boat, jon boat or even kayaks and wading can be very effective. If you have not tried it before, now is a great time - be sure to plan on fishing and learning with us. Contact Chairman to confirm event if weather is questionable.

Times: All Saturday and Sunday

Two ways to win! We will recognize three places for heaviest weight fish and three places for highest point fish for each species. First = 3 pts. Second = 2 pts. Third = 1 pt. These points will apply towards the annual Salt Water Tournament Angler of the Year competition. A fish can be entered by weight or points (angler must declare which category) but not both ways for 1 fish. Only 2 fish of each species can be entered per person. Entries must be turned in within 24 hours from the end of tournament. You can register your catches by calling or e-mail entries to Angling Activities Chairman Parks Rountrey 804-349-6001 (prountrey@comcast.net).

James River Gar: November 17-18 (blow date following weekend)

This will be a repeat of our club's successful gar tournament last year – but hopefully with bigger fish! Some nice gar can be found many places in the James River system - including the Chickahominy, but this time of year Chippokes Creek (just off the James) is the top venue for club members seeking large gar. There are many access points on the Chick and the James. Those who want to fish Chippokes can reach the area by leaving from the free Morris Creek Ramp in the Chickahominy Wildlife Management Area www.dgif.virginia.gov/wmas/detail.asp?pid=1 or for a fee use the more convenient James City County Riverfront Park Ramp <http://www.jccegov.com/recreation/parks/chickahominy-park.html> on the East end of the Route 5 Bridge over the Chick.

Times: All Saturday and Sunday

Tips: The fish will eat large minnows, suspended live - or dead on the bottom. They range from 2 to 17 lbs. and can easily be caught on 2# or 4# test with 8# mono leader. They also will take artificial baits if you have the patience to miss many hookups and stick with casting. Parks will be happy to provide some pointers in advance – feel free to call or e-mail Parks Rountrey: cell 804-349-6001 (prountrey@comcast.net).

Call in entries within 24 hours from the end of tournament to Angling Activities Chairman Parks Rountrey 804-349-6001. You cannot change an entry once you have registered it with the Chairman.

You do not need to fill out cards to turn in for the tournament, but do need a card if you want it to be registered as a club entry.

Tournament First Place Awards for both weight and points = Anglers Choice: Traditional pewter cup, \$40 Green Top gift card or a VAC Banquet ticket.
